Kuwait Aviation Show 2020 kicks off welcoming more exhibitors & visitors

The opening day of Kuwait Aviation Show 2020 kicked off on Wednesday with officials welcoming more exhibitors from around 37 countries and guests from across the country and the region, indicating a growing interest on aviation in the Middle East.

Under the auspices of the Amir of Kuwait His Highness Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, His Excellency Sheikh Mohammad Al-Abdullah Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah, Deputy Amiri Diwan Minister in the State of Kuwait and Sheikh Salman Al-Humoud Al-Sabah, Director-General, Directorate General of Civil Aviation-Kuwait, opened the event welcoming a throng of government and military officials, diplomats and the public.

The first Kuwait Aviation Show held in 2018 under the patronage of His Highness the Amir saw the participation of about 14 local and international companies with more than 60 aircraft on static display. This year's event had more than 200 companies participating from about 37 countries with more than 70 commercial and military aircraft on display.

The Kuwaiti Air Force, the Saudi Hawks team, the Emirati cavalry team, and the US and British Air Force, apart from Qatar's Skydive team performed aerial shows drawing the admiration of an enthusiastic crowd.

In a speech, Sheikh Salman Al-Sabah said Kuwait Aviation Show 2020 is the perfect platform to showcase the latest innovations in aviation and learn more about the industry's diversified economic and social impacts.

The DGCA official also noted the second edition of Kuwait Aviation Show coincided with the completion of major state projects to develop the air transport sector and the development of Kuwait airport as the Kuwaiti government commits to provide significant investment in the country's aviation sector.

He recognized the collective government effort over the past 10 months to organize the show, which include the ministries of Interior, Defense, Finance, Information, and Health, in addition to Kuwait Municipality, Kuwait Fire Service Directorate (KFSD), General Administration of Customs, Kuwaiti Direct Investment Promotion Authority (KDIPA), and Kuwait Oil Company (KOC).

The event, which will run through January 18, also offers workshops discussing the latest on technologies on aviation and an opportunity to see first-hand different types of military and passenger aircraft.

Emirates' double-decker Airbus A380, the world's biggest plane, was a crowd favorite. Visitors to the show were delighted to tour the plane appreciating its signature interiors and its industry trendsetting products across all three classes, including Emirates' latest generation Onboard Lounge.

Representatives from different diplomatic offices in South Africa, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Tunisia, Vietnam, Egypt and the United Kingdom also participated in the event showcasing their culture through arts and crafts and disseminating more information about the best places to visit in their countries.

Day 2 of the Kuwait Aviation Show 2020 continues today with more fun and action.

Kuwait Airways ready for more growth

Teffaha said Arab airlines are resilient and dealt with crisis through head on, preferring to be competitive in terms of fares and infrastructure until stability is reached. He said the Arab air transport industry has been growing steadily since 2010, increasing revenue passenger kilometers between 2010-2018 by 10.1 percent.



Etihad Airways and Kuwait Airways launch new codeshare partnership in different continents



Etihad Airways and Kuwait Airways agreed to a new codeshare partnership in destinations they serve in the Middle East, South Asia, Europe and Africa.

The UAE national carrier agreed to place its 'EY' code on Kuwait Airways operated flights from Abu Dhabi to Kuwait, Najaf and Dhaka. The Kuwaiti flag carrier, in turn, will place its 'KU' code on Etihad flights from Kuwait to Abu Dhabi, Belgrade, Casablanca, Rabat, Khartoum, Johannesburg, Lagos, Nairobi, Male in the Maldives, and Mahe in the Seychelles.

"This is a great first step in what we hope will be a mutually beneficial and growing relationship between Kuwait Airways, one of the region's oldest and most experienced airlines, and Etihad, one of its youngest and most acclaimed," said Tony Douglas, Group Chief Executive Officer, Etihad Aviation Group, noting that the joint network will create tangible benefits for customers and the two countries.

"Additionally, it gives Etihad unprecedented access to important markets not served by Etihad, particularly to Iraq and Bangladesh, where we have significant point-to-point and transfer traffic, and complements our existing services to cities such as Istanbul, enabling us to now offer flights to the city's secondary gateway," he added.

Kamel Al-Awadi, Chief Executive Officer of Kuwait Airways, said the new partnership "will bring enhanced connectivity and increased convenience to our customers" and provide more travel options for passengers.

"The codeshare partnership will give customers the simplicity of purchasing connecting flights on both airlines using one reservation, guaranteeing a seamless experience throughout their entire journey. Passengers and travel agents will be able to book directly on these flights through our website and agents' reservations systems. Furthermore, this codeshare partnership will not only enhance the relationship between the two airlines but also the strong relationship between the two brotherly states of Kuwait and the United Arab Emirates," said Al-Awadi.

Etihad Airways currently operates five return daily flights between Abu Dhabi and Kuwait, and Kuwait Airways serves Abu Dhabi with a daily service.



Turkish Aerospace puts on spotlight Hürkuş at Kuwait Aviation Show 2020



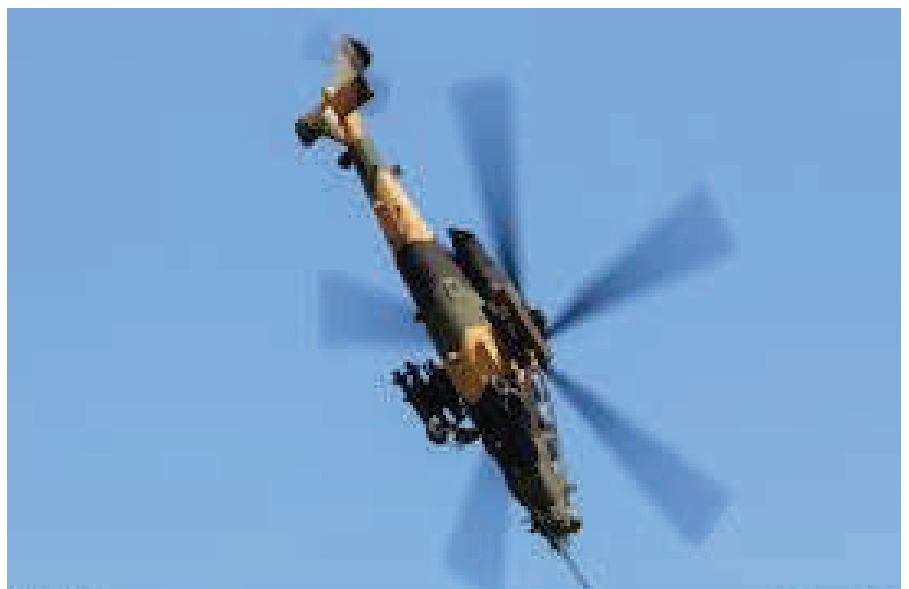

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Boeing and Kuwait Airways to launch pilot training program



Years after first forging a Memorandum of Understanding to jointly undertake a pilot training program in Kuwait, Boeing and Kuwait Airways agreed to soon make that a reality with Kuwait requiring more pilots for its planned aviation industry development.

Bernard J. Dunn, Boeing President Middle East, North Africa, Turkey (MENAT), said some 64,000 new pilots, 65,000 new technicians and about 100,000 new cabin crew would be needed over the next two decades in the Middle East.

Over the next 20 years, the region will also need about 3,100 new planes with an estimated value of \$720 billion.

Without getting into more specifics, Dunn said Kuwait Airways pilot training program's collaboration with Boeing will push through very soon in line with Kuwait's Vision 2035 which pushes for more investment in the aviation sector.

52 years of history

Boeing's history in the Middle East dates back 75 years ago. In Kuwait, the global aircraft manufacturers business relations began in 1968 when Kuwait Airways Company took delivery of three 707 airliners.

Since then the airline has operated almost every type of Boeing-produced commercial airplane, providing Kuwait citizens with access to North America, Europe, Asia and India.

"There's a lot of growth potential for us here in Kuwait and the Middle East and we're pursuing that every single day. This is really a very important market for us," said Dunn, a career officer in the US Army, who has more than 30 years of extensive experience in the Middle East.

In 2014, Kuwait Airways ordered 10 777-300ERs (Extended Range), the first of which was delivered in 2016. The 10th aircraft, featuring four seating classes, was delivered in 2017. Aviation Lease and Finance Company KSCC (ALAFSCO) is a global Sharia-compliant commercial airplane leasing company, co-owned by Kuwait Finance House and Kuwait Airways.

Boeing Defense, Space & Security

Boeing's defense presence in Kuwait can be traced back to 1974, when the Kuwaiti Air Force (KAF) ordered 36 A-4KU Skyhawks from Boeing heritage company McDonnell Douglas, said Rick Lemaster, Boeing's Vice President International Sales Defense, Space & Security.

In 2002, Kuwait and the U.S. signed an agreement for 16 AH-64D Apache helicopters and support services including spares, repairs and technical support, along with a highly skilled Maintenance Augmentation Team and Sustainment Data System to train the Kuwaiti military to support its Apache fleet.



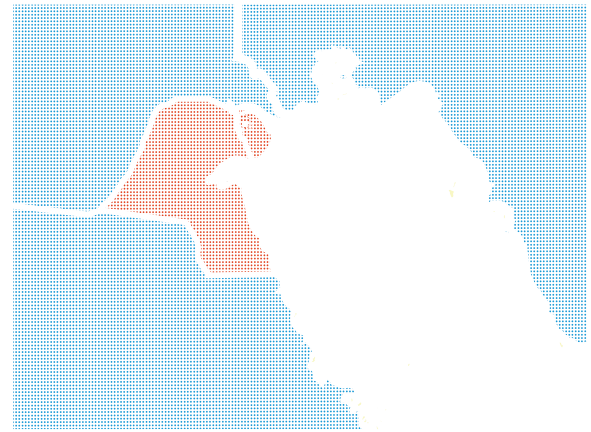

All aircraft were delivered, starting in 2007. KAF also operates two C-17 Globemaster III airlifters, delivered in 2014. In 2016, the State Department approved the sale of 28 F/A-18E/F Super Hornet aircraft with an option of an additional 12, including support, equipment and training. In 2018, the deal was finalized for 28 Super Hornets, including engineering services, radar warning receivers and aircraft armament equipment for the production and delivery of 22 single-seat E models and six two-seat F models, said Lemaster.

Boeing maintains a presence in Kuwait, with Global Marketing personnel, Apache support personnel, F/A-18 instructor pilots and C-17 field service engineers. Boeing Global Services Global Services will provide postproduction support services to Kuwait's AH-64D Apache helicopters and sustainment solutions for 28 F/A-18 Super Hornets scheduled for delivery by 2022.

Commercial Pilot training program is also being developed with Kuwait Airways Defense Kuwait Air Force Support services for AH-64D Apaches Electronic maintenance and logistics support services (GOLDesp) Maintenance and support.

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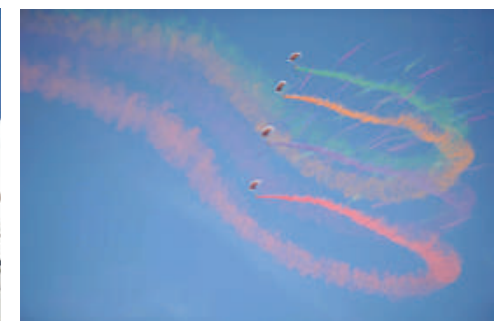
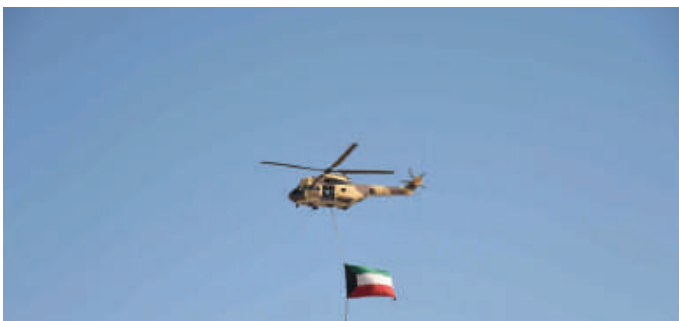

Kuwait: Unspoiled beauty

As the country is situated away from tourist destinations in the Gulf region, visitors can experience what Lonely Planet described as "a more authentically Arab feel."

There have lately been a growing number of emerging tourist destinations fast becoming the staple of holiday makers. This, on top of the traditional ones like Egypt, for instance.

While the United Arab Emirates' Dubai has gone way ahead in the region's tourism industry, Muscat in Oman; Bahrain and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia have steadily followed suit, making them busy destinations.

Kuwait, on the other hand, is "cradled between Saudi Arabia and Iraq in one of the most ancient and contested corners of the world," said Lonely Planet, which ergo gives it "a certain cachet."

"It may be as oil-rich as other Gulf countries, and its architectural landscape as experimental and audacious, but it hasn't embraced glitz and glamour in the same way: perhaps it's the years lost to the Iraqi invasion and its aftermath, or maybe it's a conscious decision not to give in to commercialism," Lonely Planet said in a piece about the country's tourism potential.

And so, as Kuwait lies far enough away from the Gulf travel hubs to the south to mean there are fewer tourists there, visitors are treated to a "more authentically Arab feel."

"Kuwait remains an oasis in a land of desert plains, and visitors may be surprised by the intriguing attractions on offer, from excellent museums and galleries to a fine souq, to a corniche with beaches and lively restaurants," the travel portal said.



Indeed, from water sports to its enticing architecture, travellers from around the world are discovering how exciting it is to be in Kuwait, which brings together a range of holidays – from cultural breaks to shopping trips.

Kuwait has cultural heritage dating back to antiquity. The country's capital, Kuwait City is popular for its modern architecture, ranging from skyscrapers to the striking Kuwait Towers, water towers, the design of which brings to mind the tiled domes of a classic mosque.

There is also the Tareq Rajab Museum, which houses a rich collection of ethnographic artifacts and Islamic art. To learn more about Kuwait's history and culture, one may visit the National Museum and Sadu House, which is dedicated to preserving traditional Bedouin art and culture.

Other Kuwait City attractions include the Grand Mosque, accommodating thousands of people; the traditional Al-Mubarakiya Souk and the expansive upscale shopping mall, The Avenues.

Kuwait City's residential Salmiya district has a small public beach and the Scientific Center, an aquarium and museum with traditional sailboats on display.

Just offshore from Kuwait City, ruins from the Mesopotamian era can be seen on Failaka Island. Indeed, the city is an exciting mix of old and the new.

Beyond the capital, Kuwait is mostly arid desert dotted with oil wells, with a few beach resorts on the southern coast.
